BEACH CLEANUPS

Join us for a few hours of sun and surf and help keep MacArthur Beach State Park clean. Beach cleanups help remove trash which might otherwise end up endangering sea turtles or shorebirds. Participants will receive gloves and trash bags. Please bring a reusable water bottle, hat and sunscreen. Community service hours will be given upon request. Free entry for participants. BIRD TALK & WALKS

Bird lovers can join a Ranger-led educational walk identifying many species of birds that make their home at John D. MacArthur Beach State Park. Reservations are recommended. Visitors should bring binoculars or rent them in the Beach Outfitters & Gift Shop. Program is free with Park admission. Take a walking tour of one of South Florida's last remaining hardwood hammocks, searching out butterflies to identify and observe, and learn which plants attract these winged wonders to your own yard. A guided exploration of MacArthur Beach State Park daily at 10 a.m. Meet in front of the Beach Outfitters & Gift Shop, bring water bottle, sun screen and insect repellant. Free with Park admission.

EDUCATIONAL REEF PROGRAM

Learn about the fish and other inhabitants of our near shore reef through a presentation and discussion. After the program is over, participants will be instructed on where to snorkel in the Park. Bring your own snorkel equipment. A diver down flag is required for snorkeling activities in the Park and can be rented daily at the Beach Outfitters & Gift Shop. FISH FACTS & FU

Learn about the various fish and creatures in our Nature Center as a Ranger target feeds the fish and provides information such as what they eat, where they live and other interesting facts. Free with Park admission.

Join us for the International Coastal Cleanup, the world's largest volunteer effort for our oceans and waterways. Ocean trash can entrap and strangle ocean wildlife including endangered sea turtles. KAYAK RENTA

Kayaking provides visitors a unique experience; paddle around the estuary, under Burnt Bridge onto the Lake Worth Lagoon, and visit Munyon Island — an outlying part of the Park with a rich history. You may see wildlife depending on the season. Manatees, dolphins, rays, and a variety of birds are commonly spotted, allowing an up-close view. RECREATIONAL SKILLS

BIRDING BY KAYAK

Take a guided kayak tour with a Ranger, paddling through Lake Worth Lagoon to Munyon Island, with your sights set on spotting estuary birds and migratory songbirds on the island. The cost for the two-hour tour is \$25 for a single kayak and \$40 for a double kayak (2 people.) Bring your water bottle, binoculars, and favorite birding guide, keeping in mind they might get wet. Binoculars are available for rent at an additional charge. Reservations required, space is limited, call for information at 561-624-6952.

INTRO TO SNORKELING

Learn the basics of snorkeling including proper fin and mask selection and fitting, snorkeling safety, diving techniques and more. This is a land based course and is free with Park admission. Reservations required, space is limited, call for information at 561-624-6952.



INTRO TO SURFING

Ranger led course of instruction on the basics of surfing, lessons are on land and water. Adults and children 10 and older (children under 18 must be accompanied in water by adult.) Reservations required, free with Park admission. Call 561-624-6952 for more information.
